At that point, "we received utomatic weapons fire from upstairs, coming through the ceiling then zigzag across the floor and through the walls," Jay said.

When agents tried to open the door to the stairs, Mathews fired another six or seven shots and the agents fled the house at about 2:30 p.m., Jay said.

A few hours later, a helicopter turned a floodlight on the house and illumination flares were fired into the stucture. The house caught fire from the intensely hot white phosphorus flares, but Mathews appeared at an upstairs window and began firing at the helicopter, Jay

As agents returned fire, Mathews moved to a corner of the house and began shooting at them, he said.
